TRADITIONAL PHONES

CapTel 840/840i — For people who are comfortable with a traditional-style telephone. Large easy to read display with built in answering machine.

(CapTel 840i requires telephone service & high-speed Internet. CapTel 840 model available in most areas for people who do not have Internet access.)

TOUCH SCREEN PHONES

CapTel 2400i — For those who prefer touch-screen technology. Large colorful display, dial-by-picture capability, and built-in answering machine.

(Requires telephone service & high-speed Internet)

LARGE VISUAL DISPLAY

CapTel 880i — Ideal for people with low vision, who have difficulty viewing standard-sized captions. Extra large font sizes & display options for easy reading.

(Requires telephone service & high-speed Internet)

MOBILE APPS

WebCapTel — Options from CapTel service providers let you use any telephone or mobile device while viewing captions on your Internet browser window.

CapTel phones connect with a free Captioning Service to provide the captions. You can hear the other party, plus read what they say for added clarity.



1) You talk to the other party – who in turn talks back for you to hear.



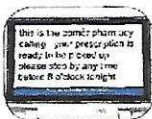
2) Everything the other party says also goes through our captioning service ...

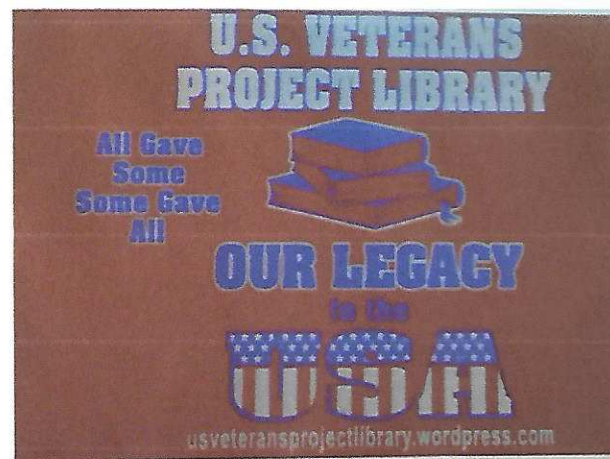
